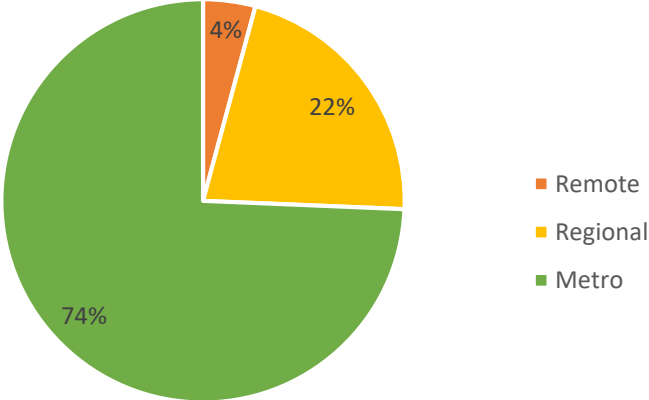

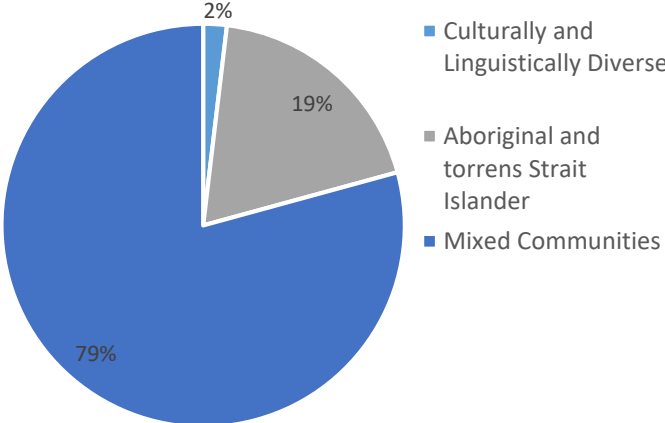

2018 FUNDING ALLOCATION

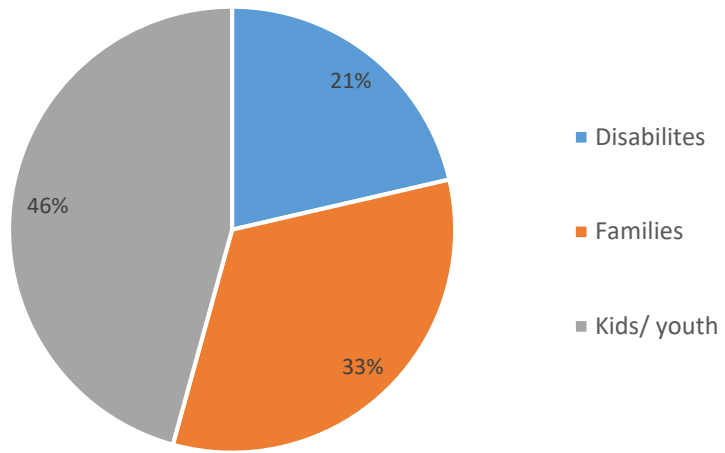
RECIPIENT LOCATION
